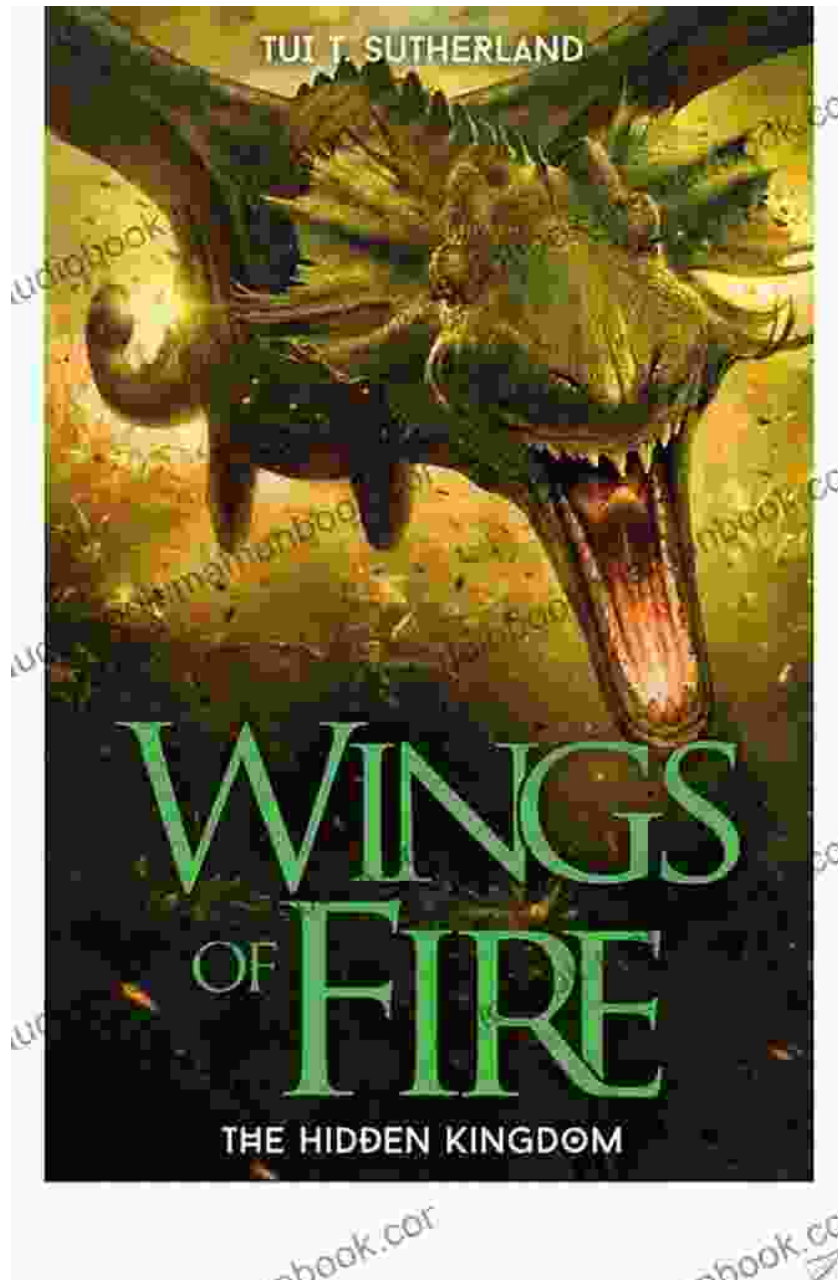

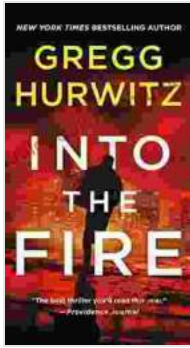

Cameron is a graduate of the University of California, Berkeley, and she holds a Master's degree in medieval history from the University of Oxford. She lives in California with her family.

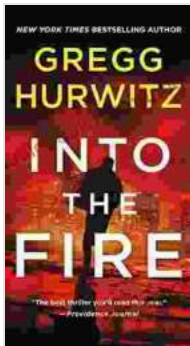

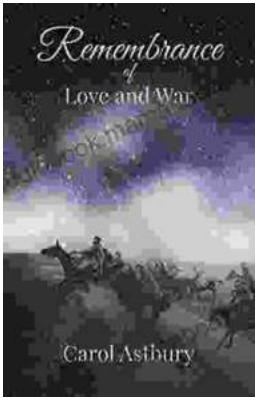

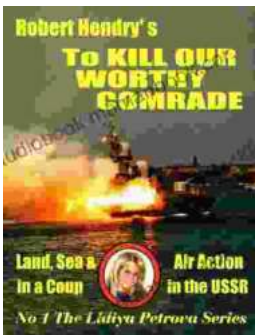
