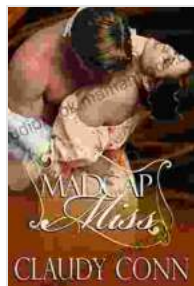


The Madcap Miss Claudy Conn: A Legendary Aviatrix and Daredevil

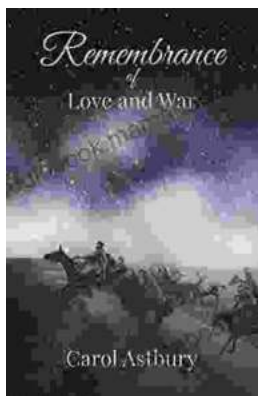
